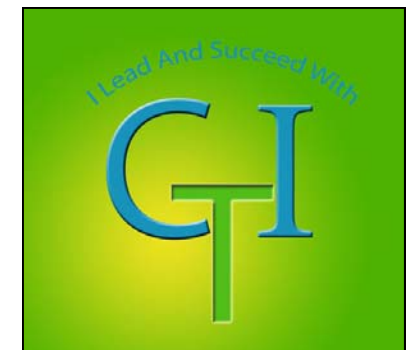

## What is Georgia CTI?

Career Technical Instruction (CTI) services in Georgia are designed to support students with disabilities who are enrolled in career, technical, and agricultural education. The goal of the secondary (grades 9-12) level support services is to provide these students with employment opportunities at the completion of the career, technical, and agricultural experience. The role of the CTI coordinator is to provide intervention assistance to students with disabilities served under the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) in CTAE classes.

## What are the CTI goals and objectives?

### Goals

To provide students with disabilities at the secondary level with entry-level job skills in broad or specific occupation cluster.

**Objectives:** To provide at the high school level Technology/Career support services for students with disabilities.

\* To monitor secondary students with disabilities to ensure delivery of appropriate services and accommodations as they participate in Technology/Career programs.

\*To provide secondary students with disabilities the opportunity to successfully participate in Technology/Career programs.

## What are the CTI requirements?

Students who receive CTI intervention services are students who receive Special Education services under the requirements of IDEA. These students are eligible for services under one or more of the following disability categories:

- Mildly or Moderately Intellectually Disabled
- Specific Learning Disabled
- Emotionally and Behaviorally Disordered
- Speech/Language Impaired
- Visually Impaired
- Other Health Impaired
- Orthopedically Impaired
- Deaf and Hard of Hearing
- Autism

\*The student must be placed into the special education program in one or more of the areas listed above under the requirements of IDEA

\*The student must be enrolled in a regular Technology/Career program

\*The student requires specially designed instruction to be able to participate successfully in the Technology/Career program



## CTI State Leadership Conferences

The focus of the CTI Leadership Conferences is to provide students with disabilities, enrolled in Technology/Career classes, programs with high quality interactive leadership activities. The purpose of the conferences is to reward students showing the greatest improvement in Technology/Career and work adjustment skills, and to recognize the achievement of these students. The Leadership Conferences also serve as an incentive for other students with disabilities to improve their skills and to:

\*Provide opportunity for cultural growth and personal development

\*Improve self confidence and instill a sense of self worth.

\*Provide experiences not otherwise available to students with disabilities.
