This year fifth graders in Georgia will be held to promotion standards as required by the Georgia State Board of Education and the Newton County Board of Education.

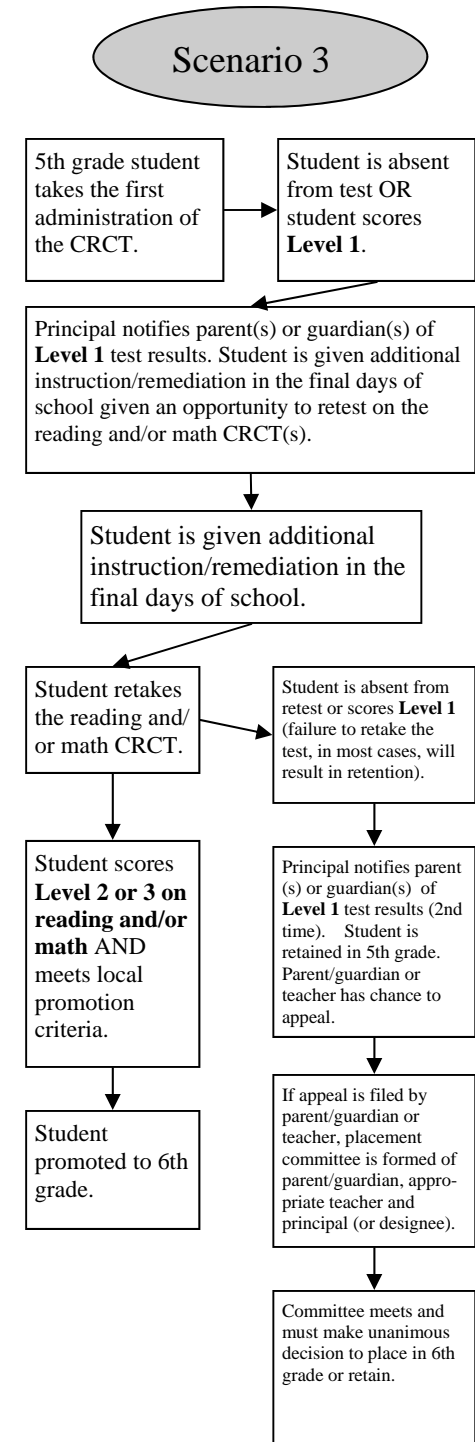
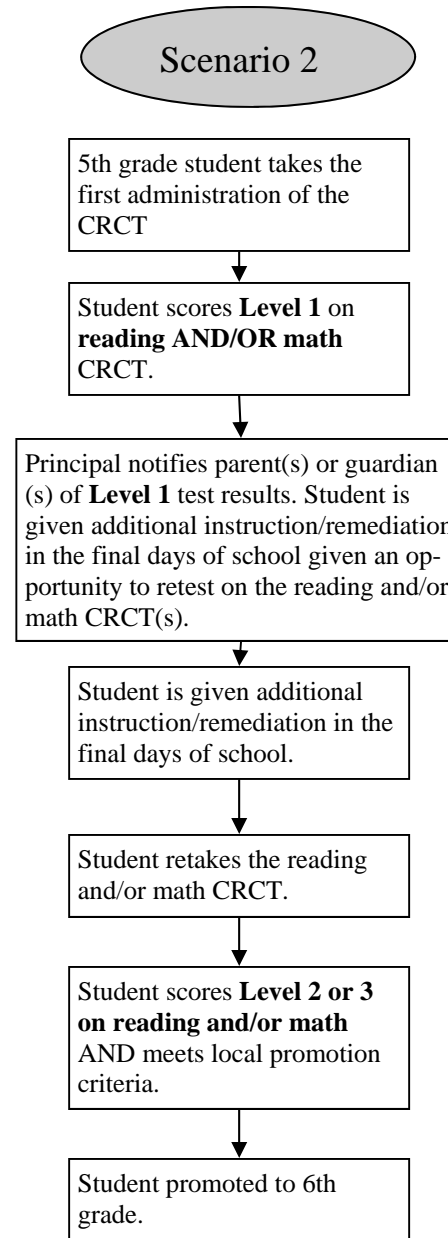
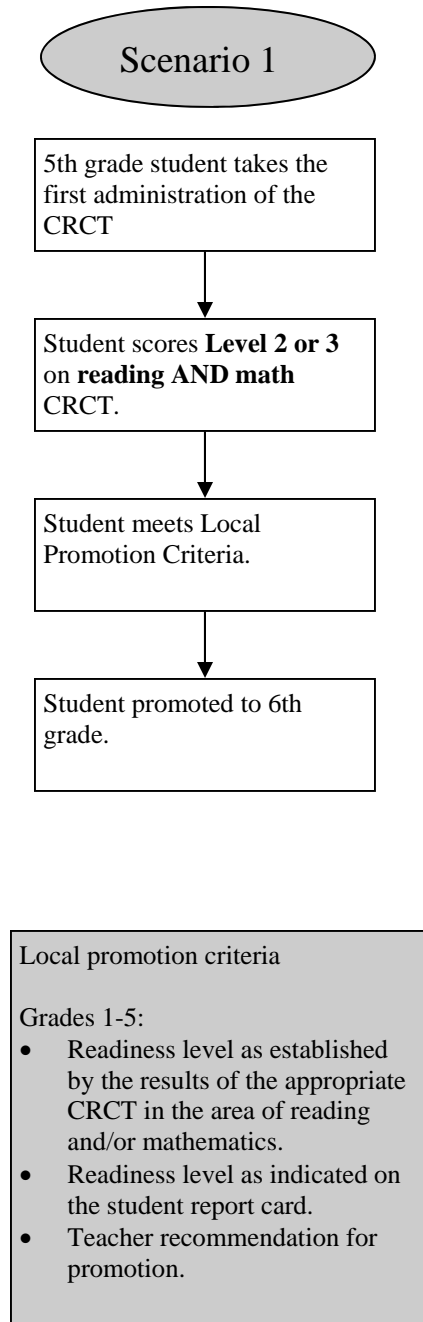
To help parents understand these standards, this brochure is being provided along with parent meetings at each school. Please make plans to attend the meetings when they are held at your child's school.

2012 CRCT Scores Critical for Fifth Graders

All students in grades three through eight will take the Criterion Referenced Competency Test (CRCT) this spring; but, for fifth graders, the test is a critical part of promotion to sixth grade. Georgia now requires that fifth graders pass the reading and math portions of the CRCT (score of Level 2 or 3) along with other grade level criteria to be promoted to sixth grade. Students who perform below grade level on the CRCT reading and or math tests (score of Level 1) or are absent from the administration of the test will be given the opportunity to participate in additional reading and/or math instruction during the final days of the school year along with another chance to take the reading CRCT. If the student still performs below grade level, the student may be retained in fifth grade for the next school year. Parent(s) or guardian(s), and/or teacher(s) may appeal the decision to retain the student. The principal (or designee) will meet with parents or guardian and the student's teacher(s) to review the student's overall academic achievement. The group will then make a decision to place the student in sixth grade or retain the student in fifth grade. The promotion/retention policy also applies to third and eighth grade students.

What are staff members in the Newton County Schools doing to prepare students for success?

- Teachers have been trained and are required to implement sound, research-based instructional strategies.
- The school system has taken steps to insure students have appropriate instructional materials including regular, remedial, and supplemental materials.
- There are supplementary teachers at some grade levels to work with at-risk students.
- Utilizing print and software materials, teachers provide test preparation activities.
- The Cognitive Abilities Tests are given to provide teachers and parents with data that can help identify students' strengths and weaknesses.
- Student Support Teams assist teachers with classroom modifications designed to meet a student's individual needs.
